BHWP is for the birds ...

Bowman’s Hill Wildflower Preserve has been a birding hot spot in Bucks County for years. The reason is simple. Located on a major flyway and with a variety of habitats, over 100 species can be seen over the course of a year, including over 20 warbler species during migration.

When birding, we suggest you start at the Visitor Center. Watch feeder birds through a huge bank of windows at our Bird Observatory. Before you head off on a walk, check the clipboard there for recent notable sightings, and pick up a trail map. BHWP offers three miles of trails through forest, stream and meadow habitat. Over 700 species of plants make our grounds delightful for bird and birder alike. Mid-April through late-May, we offer Saturday morning bird walks for your convenience. Check our calendar.

Within walking distance, Bowman’s Tower, the Thompson-Neely House and Delaware Canal State Park provide hill top and river bank habitat for even more bird sightings. Visit BHWP, and bird them all in one stop.

After your walk, enjoy the Visitor Center. Our Platt Collection of Birds, Nests and Eggs is downstairs on the lower level. Our reference library, in the auditorium, has extensive volumes on bird lore. And our gift shop offers a fine selection of field guides, books and CD’s for birders.

BHWP relies on your help for sighting reports. You’re encouraged to leave us a copy of your annotated checklist or post it to ebird.org.

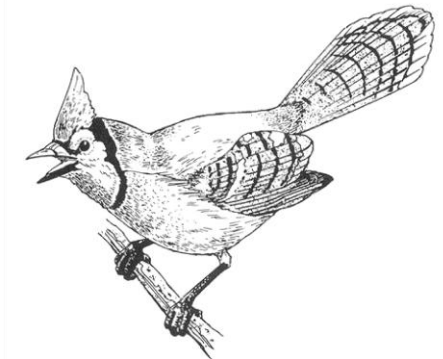
