**Investigate a Flower up Close!** 

Try one or all of the following activities to help you discover more about native flowers.

#### FLOWER PARTS AND JOBS

Just like you use eyes to see, nose to smell and ears to hear, each piece of the flower has a job too.


Sepals often keep the flower safe, like a warm blanket, until it opens.

The petals are used to catch a pollinators eye, be it butterfly, bee bat or bird. They are like the big signs along the road that say: "EAT HERE".

The stamens are the male parts of the flower. They hold the pollen until it is ready to be used for pollination. Stamens have two parts, the anther is where the pollen is kept and the filament is the stalk that holds the anther.

The pistil is the female part of the flower. It waits for pollen to land on it either by wind, insect, bird or fly. The pistil has two main parts as well. The stigma is the top where the pollen will land. The ovaries are at the flower base, and once pollinated, will eventually grow into a fruit.

The peduncle holds the flower to the stem of the plant.


## ALL AROUND THE PRESERVE

#### COLOR WITH FLOWERS

Did you know you could color with flowers? The pigments in the petals are easily transferred to paper with a squish and a rub. Draw a flower in the space below with big petals, stems and leaves. Pluck a petal off of a colorful flower and squish it between your fingers. Take the squished petal and rub it on your drawing. You should see the color appear on your coloring page. You can try coloring with a leaf too. What happens? You can use flowers from your garden, your yard or ones you bought from the store. "Always ask permission before you pick. And just remember, no picking at the Preserve please. We want everyone to be able to enjoy our native wildflowers!"
